THE KOMAGATA MARU EPISODE

On May 23rd, 1914, the Komagata Maru entered Burrard Inlet carrying 376 South Asian passengers looking forward to starting their lives in Canada. Invoking discriminatory regulations intended to reduce immigration from British India, the Canadian government denied entry to almost all of the passengers.
