27. W.C. Hopkinson to W.W. Cory

Vancouver, 25 September, 1909

Sir,

I am now in receipt of your letter of the 17th inst., with enclosures, and beg to state that I will re-submit them as directed.

For the week ending today, the situation among the Hindus is practically the same as the week before. There are a few Hindus who have come in from the upper country, and this is the commencement of the influx to this city for the coming winter.

Teja Singh with his wife and two children left on the 23rd inst. for New York, and will be away for some time. I have not been able to learn his full programme for this tour, but hope to be able to get particulars within the coming week.

A local newspaper 'The World' has in its issue to-day advice from Winnipeg that about 120 French Canadians with families are en route to the Fraser River Sawmills, to replace the Hindus.
