MEMORANDUM, -

Mr. Cory.

On February 6th, 1915, Amar Singh left for India via Seattle. On his arrival at Hong Kong, owing to the Singapore riots, he was unable to get passage to India, and in company with ten or eleven other Hindus decided to walk through to Rangoon via Siam. He had in his possession a letter signed by Mr. Malcolm R. J. Reid to the effect that he had been rendering assistance to the late Inspector Hopkinson in connection with enquiries made regarding sedition among the Hindus in Canada. A report has reached Ganga Ram, brother of Amar Singh, that Amar Singh in company with his walking companions has been arrested at Moor May, Burma, and Ganga Ram request that through the proper channels representations be made as to Amar Singh's loyalty and his desire at all times to uphold constitutional authority which, I may say, was in the opinion of the Department his attitude while in Vancouver. Full description of this party is:- Amar Singh, son of Hakim Singh, village Barian, police station, Mahil Pur, district, Hoshiar Pur, Punjab, India. I am merely acknowledging Ganga Ram's letter and stating that the proper authorities have been asked to deal with the matter.
