Acting on war-time instructions we are still carrying out the practice of furnishing to Malcolm Reid, Inspector of Immigration at Vancouver, copies of all Chinese and Hindoo messages filed with us.

Mr. Reid informs us he has found these copies of great assistance to him in his work and would like us to continue to send him these copies.

I feel that instructions were issued to us purely as a war measure and that it will be greatly to our advantage to discontinue the practice which lays us open to a charge of divulgence of the contents of telegrams entrusted to us.

Will you please advise if we shall discontinue the observance of your instructions.
