

Mount Sicker Miners' Union No. 215, Western Federation of Miners, to Sir  
Richard McBride, Premier of British Columbia

Mount Sicker, B.C., 20 December, 1906

Dear Sir,

We the Officers and Members of the Mt. Sicker Miners Union No. 215,  
W.F. of M. in Meeting assembled Dec. 12th 1906,

Resolved

that whereas a great influx of Hindoos has set in to this Province, through  
Misrepresentation of Local conditions, and

whereas, said Hindoos are wandering in bands around different localities  
with absolutely no means of support, depending on charity and at times  
using forcible means to obtain food and shelter, and

whereas this is working a great injustice on the Hindoos as well as the  
citizens of this province, and

whereas immigration of this class to this Province is encouraged directly  
and indirectly by the transportation companies, Be it therefore resolved  
that this Union do its part in bringing this matter pointedly to the notice  
of the proper authorities requesting said authorities to take immediate  
steps to stop the incoming of the Hindus and all Asiatics who do not make  
desireable citizens and whose presence is detrimental to the welfare of  
the people, and,

Be it resolved that a copy of their resolutions be forwarded to Sir Wilfrid  
Laurier, Premier of Canada, and to Hon. Richard McBride Premier of British  
Columbia and to the Miners Magazine and Western Clarion for publication
