A WORD AND A BLOW.

Fate to Be Expected From the
Yellow Races.

London, January 23.—A gloomy prophecy as to the probability of conflicts in the Pacific Ocean was made today by the well-known lecturer on military strategy, T. W. M. Maguire, at a meeting of the Royal Colonial Institute.

Mr. Maguire described the Pacific Ocean as the "strategic centre of mankind," and warned both the United States and Great Britain "that nothing could give them security but a race of military men," as with nations like Germany and Japan it was a word and a blow.

The yellow races, he said, were going to demand equality of treatment. Japan was at present Great Britain's ally, but that would only last as long as the British alliance was worth having.

Great Britain's territories in the Pacific Ocean were, he considered, by no means safe and "the Japanese might attack and defeat the Americans any day."
