Dear Mr. Stevens,

I have your favor of the 29th addressed to me at Calgary. I have noted in the press the matter you refer to re Hindu Immigration. Of course if there is any truth in the press reports something will have to be done by way of amendment to the Act to prevent this state of affairs. But as you are well aware there is nothing further than what the Act provides can be done at present or until an amendment is secured. I presume your wire to Ottawa re the holding of the vessel at Port Simpson reached there after my departure, and as a consequence I am not aware of its contents. I will inquire into it upon my return to the Capital which will be about the middle of the month.
