
I have to thank you for your courtesy in reprimanding the Japanese boatman yesterday for conveying Hindus to the ship, KOMOGATA MARU. I would further point out for your information, that the owner of a fishing boat, carrying passengers would be liable to prosecution in the Courts, unless such boat had a passenger license.

I should be glad if you would point out to your countrymen, therefore, that not only are they rendering themselves liable to getting into trouble for aiding Hindus to escape, but also the Harbour Commissioners will probably take action as above mentioned.
