Sir:-

I beg to confirm my night lettergram of the 6th instant, as follows:-

"Message forwarded Governor General Ottawa tonight, begins, Reference Province sixth reply to your enquiry Immigration Agent untrue. Reid never supplied anything still starving. Officials made search fourth, found no provisions treating cruelly appoint commission for investigation? Reply paid ten words. Signed Passengers Komogata Maru. Message ends. Medical Inspector Monree visited ship today and offered to take ship's Doctor (Hindu) ashore, but Gardit Singh refused permit him to ashore to obtain medicines although representations has been made to me same were urgently needed."

Also my night lettergram of the 7th instant, as follows:-

"Gardit Singh has tonight wired the Governor General as follows. Begins, Governor General, Ottawa. Reid disallowed my landing; have coal cargo to sell cant take more cargo; suffering heavy losses and starvation. Charter money eleven thousands bound to pay before eleventh. Cant arrange unless go ashore otherwise lose ship. Government responsible of damage. Reid disallow conversayion with anybody; given many notices, no response. Charterer, Komogata Maru. Ends. Patrol Boat Winnimac in commission tonight for first time."
