Out of your numerous hardships, hardship of keeping passengers hungry, is an extraordinary one of which you are responsible. I do not know that what is your object to keep the passengers hungry.

All my passengers are hungry from yesterday morning.

My man cannot go ashore till your further order.

I hope to get a reasonable answer for this.
