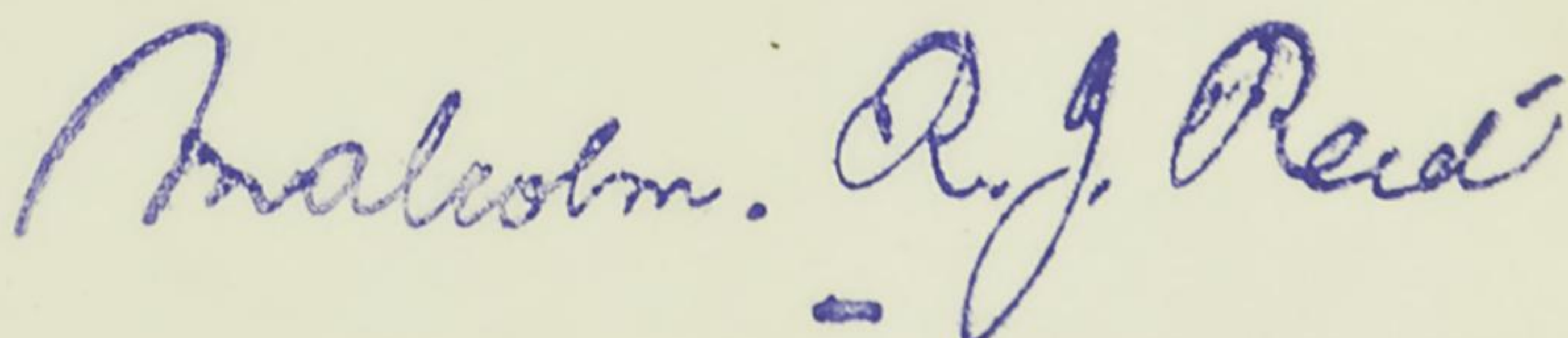
Dear Sir:-
