For your information I beg to transcribe below

"June 19th 1914, No. 43: Please oblige me by  
sending the receipt and true copy of my telegram  
from telegram office on my expenses which I sent  
to the Secretary Governor General, Ottawa on 17th  
instant through you by your officer Captain McColl;  
so that I may be satisfied."

To this letter, I replied, as under:-

"Replying to your letter No. 43, of even date,  
I enclose herewith receipt dated June 17th for  
telegram sent to His Royal Highness, the Governor  
General at Ottawa, and a prepaid reply, in all  
amounting to \$3.70.

"I did not keep any copy of your telegram.

"The balance of your \$5.00 is herewith returned,  
namely \$1.30. Kindly acknowledge receipt.

"The Telegraph Company were not sure of the cost  
of the return message; hence I have not adjusted  
this matter before."

I would also embody letter from Gurdit Singh  
No.,44, as follows:-

"Your favor of today to hand. In reply to your  
last paragraph I again beg to request you that you  
please take the trouble of bringing me a copy of my  
wire to the Secretary Governor General, Ottawa on my  
cost from the Telegraph Company, so that I may be satis-  
fied about my real wordings.

"The Telegraph Company will surely copy it when  
it charges its cost.
