I am informed that there is no immediate regular fund on hand in the Vancouver Immigration bank account to pay the salary of the special guards which have been employed recently. Now that the sensational episode in connection with the Komagata Maru is settled, the services of these men is being dispensed with and it is very necessary that they should be paid immediately. Will you be good enough to wire through to the bank and to Mr. Reid Superintendent authority for an overdraft to the amount of about three thousand dollars which is absolutely necessary to cover wages of special guards and other small incidentals. I can personally vouch for the importance and necessity of this, but which does not include hire of tugs etc.
