The Yoshiwara was the area of a Japanese city to which prostitution was confined.

The principal towns in 1908 — Tokyo  
with a pop of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  million Osaka

and Nagasaki. Yokohama may be  
regarded as the European headquarters  
indeed it is a largely European town.
