I am in receipt of your letter of the 19th inst re the report of Mr Dady Barjer on the Hindu situation in the Pacific Coast, and drawing my attention to his suggestion of the establishment of some organization to look after the Hindus on arrival in the United States port on the Pacific Coast.

In this connection I wish to state that I have collected a lot of information and data which it was my purpose to lay before you on my return to Vancouver. I did not make any comment on Mr Burjer's report in view of my intentions to place this matter before the Government, and I was desirous also that an independent view of the situation be ~~present~~ brought to your attention.

There is no doubt in my mind that an organisation for the protection of Hindus ~~movement~~ is absolutely necessary and the need of it has been demonstrated more forcibly during my four months stay in this locality. I will try and lay the matter before you on my return to Vancouver and discuss the situation from different view points.
