Referring to your file O.T.7.E. and the correspondence which has passed between us concerning Mr. Singh and party, who desire to proceed to Duncan, B.C., on the 30th instant, sailing from Southampton by the ss. "Antonia", I am now able to inform you that cable advice has this morning been received from our Department at Ottawa to the effect that Hari, Mrs. Amro Singh and son, Sohan, and Mayo Singh, with his wife and two children, may go forward providing they comply with the regulations applicable to their cases, and as outlined in the Department letters issued in their favour.

With respect to Battan Singh, who is said to be proceeding to Canada as a tourist for six months, after which period he would return to India, the Department state that no assurance can be given that he would be admitted to the Dominion, as it will be necessary for him to pass medical and civil inspection at the port of arrival.

I return herewith the original Departmental letters issued in favour of the above named, together with Certificates of Registration in the cases of Basant Singh and Mayo Singh, which the party should carry with them for presentation to the officers at port of landing.
