I would refer you to my two letters of August 11th, in which you were instructed to report forthwith to this office if you wished to make application to remain in Canada, and of August 17th wherein you were informed that recent instructions from the Department indicated that it might be possible for your wife to make application for your entry to this country.

On going further into the matter I find that the recent instructions covered cases where local East Indian girls might make application for the entry to Canada of their fiances from India, and, as you are aware, you would not come into this category in view of the fact that you entered Canada as a student and are now a married man.

In view of the foregoing, I would instruct you to appear at this office forthwith if you wish to make application to remain in Canada. Please give this your prompt attention.
