My dear Mr. Mayo Singh:

I am enclosing herewith a copy of the letter which I received today from Mr. Jolliffe regarding my representation on behalf of Karnail Singh Saroya.

Although the letter was written by Mr. Jolliffe on December 1st, through a stenographer's error it was posted by ordinary mail and doubtless was then further delayed by the heavy Christmas mail.

You will note from Mr. Jolliffe's letter that he has recommended that this case be reviewed and I understand from Ottawa that Mr. MacKinnon will cancel the deportation order and a Special Order-in-Council will be passed granting permanent residence to Karnail Singh.

I have asked Ottawa to communicate directly with you as soon as the deportation order is cancelled and a decision arrived at and I have no doubt that by the time you receive this you will have already been informed of the decision.

I do not think that there is any further need to worry about your son-in-law and I sincerely wish you, your son-in-law and the rest of the family all success.
