Her father: ARJAN S. SANGRAY
came at age 17 on the "700 boat"
in 1907. He was a farmer, unmarried.
(late) > pos: "Indine" ?
He went quickly to Enderberry to
work in a mill for an "American"
He was from Hoshinapon
wages were good up to WWI, then
dropped afterwards.
He was liberal in Punjab +
was a religious man. He read
the Granth S. all the time.

He returned to India in 1921.
There he married + in 1923 he
returned w/ w. Ge + Amar, who
was 6 mo old on arrival. They
lived on the island, fr. work
in the mill

One of the first families here was that of Hakham S.

In 1928 a friend of her Pa (same village)
visited them from the Helona area. Because
of A's mo's asthma, she went there in 1929.
They bought a farm + raised vegetables.
Later 50% of the land was put in fruit
trees. Amar had one sister. There were v.
few ES there + the number didn't increase
much

While there (1929-1949) she was quite isolated. She did have much to do w/ school functions, although she finished h/s. She went to Oakland H.S. in the rural area. She did have one white friend who she kept in contact with until the 1950's.

(Mit S. was a friend of her fa)

→ in 1949 her fa's health was not good. She was ~26. They sold the farm + went to India. Her fa died there. She married.

IK BAL SARA, who was a practicing lawyer. In 1952 they returned to Vancouver. He was admitted to the bar. - the first EI professional.

They separated later. They have one daughter. She has just returned from India.

She never remarried.

She knew well the Kewas + the Bolas stories.
