141. present Punjab pop, 55 Moslem, 33 Hindu, 11 Sikh.
while less than 1% total Indian pop, 1/6 total fighting pop in War.

early 1907 was beginning of information flow. while educated mostly in E and W,
around Amritsar particularly dense seditious. particularly around Ferozepore.

142. in the Chenab Canal Colony dissatisfaction w/proposed canal tenures.

leaders, Lajpat Rai, Ajit Singh, deported.

flared up again in 1909

143. tells of Hardayal, Hindu, went to Punjab U, then to Oxford, surrendered his
scholarship, returned to India, preached 144 seditious in Lahore, went to U.S.,

organized Ghadr party. 145. arrived in S.F., 1911. Ghadr sent to India

146. arrested 1914, as undesirable alien, fled to Switzerland.

December 1913 a poem from the Ghadr sang at Vancouver Sikh meeting.

1913 3 American Sikhs went to Punjab.

147. Gurdit Singh (from Amritsar), contractor Malay States, Singapore.

148. notes that Indians do not distinguish between Indian and other Commonwealth
governments.
