187. He visited Mewa Singh prior to his execution - M.S. asked him to dispose of some Indian property in the interests of his family. He did trust Samuel S., who was an old friend, because of his change of religion.

187. 1913 - Samuel S.'s conversion - V. hostile reaction by Siches.
once beaten. Mewa Singh was at least sympathetic
to the 3 who did it in that he would not reveal S.S.'s
whereabouts. Again essential one was subsequent.
