P 265: In the Anti-Oriental Riots of Sept 1907 (prompted by Japanese immigration): "Considerable damage was done to the Chinese section, but the Japanese forced the rioters + fought them off"

P 266: "There are now (1927) probably more than 18,000 Japanese in B.C. . They have invaded the sawmills, the fishing industry, farming and almost every walk of life. Their energy + ability make their presence a very serious problem.

P 267: There are today probably not more than five thousand Hindus in the province. They have ~~entered~~ entered into the sawmills as unskilled labourers, and into dairying & farming in a small way; but their competition can scarcely be said to have been felt.

p264: Legislature, 1924: "The Oriental activity in this country threatens the very life of the Anglo-Saxons on the Pacific coast. I agree that the Oriental menace is a grave one . . . 20 years ago only workmen felt the pinch, but today all industries are affected. And the white people are patronizing the Oriental. There should be an educational campaign carried on."
