Honorable Sir: Re: Application to the Immigration
Dept. for permanent stay in Canada
of Karnail Singh Marora

Further to my letter of August 24th, 1948 and yours
in response to that of August 18th, 1948.

We have made this application for his permanent stay
with the Immigration Dept. at Victoria, B.C. on September 24th,
1948. However, according to the Immigration regulations they
have rejected this case at the Board of Inquiry; but, an appeal
was forwarded to Ottawa through a prominent lawyer, Mr. W.
Morasby, K.C. of Victoria. I am enclosing, herewith, a copy of
the brief Mr. Morasby presented to the Minister of Immigration
on behalf of Karnail Singh. May I ask you to help me in this
case by taking this personally to the Immigration authorities
at Ottawa. I will endeavor to get a copy of the Board of
Inquiry's brief from the Immigration office in Victoria and
will mail it to you as soon as possible.
