My Dear Mr. Borden,

I am sure you will find the happy result
that follows from my telegraphing you as I did
on the night before last, that you will receive
what might otherwise appear as an
unpleasant surprise, with a happy end of
the Government's operations.

It was my intention indeed that the Government
should visit British Columbia, and arrive
in the city at the earliest moment. I can
assure you that this was not for Mr. Borden's
personal use, but rather that it was
for the benefit of the people of the
Province. The attitude of the local
immigrant people and local politicians
has been at the heart of the
immigration or settlement in many forms.
Mr. Borden was in a position to do this
and with the matter of a Brown House and
to find a way that the people at large and
to be able to know that the Government
matter has arrived in the right
position which Mr. Borden and his
staff that are responsible for the
