Dear Sir,
I beg to enclose herewith copies of an article appearing in the "Manitoba Daily Province" of the 1st inst., regarding a Chinese man named H. H. H. H.
In this connection I must say that the man, concerning this and who was released from the prison at the St. James Hotel, and arrived at this port in January last. In being questioned, he stated that he was destined for Canada in connection with some business which he had to transact there, after which he was to go to Berlin and then back, eventually to Berlin after visiting the old country. In the meantime, which was being met by the fact that he had no objection to being released, he was permitted to land as a tourist. I did not see anything of him until the month of May last, when I saw notice in the Globe and Mail, and was surprised to learn that he had returned. In the course of conversation I ascertained from him that he was leaving for Canada by the outgoing steamer boat, which was to leave within a couple of days. I did not see him again until the day before
