Sir,

I beg to state that I have wired you as follows:-

“Suren M. Bose Bengali citizen and later applied for permission
via the post office, Varanasi, to enter Canada on March 1907. He
arrived in Canada in November 1907. He is subject to the provisions re-
ferred Section 3 para 829 and 830. - This applies to his admission per
Direction being an illegal immigrant from India. Thereupon he was denied
and held offence.”

In connection with this case I beg to report that at 12.30
noon this morning Inspector J. C. Dench from this dock brought
up this Bengali man to me for examination. I met him at
the station and there interrogated this man and learnt from him
that he had landed in Vancouver about the month of December 1907;
that he spent four or five months in Vancouver and then went into
the United States where he pursued studies in different Colleges
but for the last year had been lecturing on India. I informed
him that he was not admissible as he had no Canadian domicile
and under the present Act only people who had had three years
previous residence could be admitted to Canada, and in his case
if he now applied for permission, it would be necessary to conform
to para 829 and 830. - and I further told him that I had
refused his admission under section 3 of the Immigration Act,
giving him at the same time an outline of the contents of the
