Sir,

I beg to state that I have cited you, as follows: -

"Suren M. Bose Bengali National applied for admission via this dock. Arrived from India on 10th December 1907, and worked in Canada, balance of time in United States. Admission refused Section 3 p.m. 320 and 321. Will apply to be admitted the following day as tourist to lecture here and visit in an evening concert and visiting of India. Arrives in New London and New York."

In connection with this case I beg to report that at 1.10 p.m. this morning Inspector J.L. Dettie from this dock brought up this Bengali Suren M. Bose for examination. I met him at the Station and there interrogated this man and learnt from him that he had landed in Vancouver about the month of December 1907; that he spent four or five weeks in Vancouver and then went into the United States where he pursued studies in different colleges and for the last year had been lecturing in India. I told him that he was not admissible as he had no Canadian domicile and under the present act only people who had had three years previous residence could be admitted to Canada, and in his case if he now applied for permission, it would be necessary to conform to p.m. Orders 320 and 321, - and I further told him that I had refused his admission under section 3 of the Immigration Act, giving him at the same time an outline of the contents of the
