their names being Thaler Singh, Kachhi Ram and Dilli.  
I am keeping an eye on them and watching their  
movements as far as possible.

On Sunday last I learned from a  
reliable source that Teja Singh is likely to be  
elected from the position he is at present holding,  
due to the fact that his opponents are becoming  
suspicious of him owing to his spending with  
their money and being unable to satisfactorily  
account for most of his transactions, thereby  
causing three of the delegates to withdraw their  
names.
