I have received your registered letter.
I am glad I received one letter in your handwriting.
Dear Sir, I am writing you now I write about tomorrow.
We have our troubles and we do not like to trouble you
with our troubles, but we have no one to look after our
business. Our minds are troubled day and night. We
have troubles every day but we do not want to be better
for us to die.

Really we are in a very bad position. It will be
worse if we die but if we leave it is better than
we die, and then we ourselves all this trouble. These
troubles do not let us sleep at night. I am writing
of what took place last night.

First all this disturbance between the two sides
a speech that I am sorry you are not yet to be sent
back. We have all the provisions ready and it is
advisable for you to go back quietly for it is so bad
for you to stay here any longer. It has been arranged by
put the provisions on horse outside the three mile limit.
He informed him that the provisions are ready to go
back but we must provision to last us as far as
Calcutta because we do not know you that you will
put the provisions on the three mile limit as we must
then put us here.

We do not intend to get off at any place but
are going right through to Calcutta but he informed
us that we would be forced to go back by the police
and to take his advice and go back quietly. He
