

Copy of letter from Daljit Singh to the Immigration Agent complaining about difficulty in getting provisions on board

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To the Immigration Agent,
Vancouver, B.C.

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that yesterday I sent one of our men ashore to purchase provisions according to your enclosed order of 10th. You returned from the sea, saying "that provisions will be supplied this afternoon". Finding the same thing repeated, and ordered the man to come back to take away the provisions he bought, brought as above by local Hindus. I waited up to now. No information whatsoever, and up now we shall be as before but the man persisted in saying that even your written orders are not carried out properly, and even you do not know your men.

Out of your numerous activities, besides of having passengers hungry, is an unnecessary one of which you are responsible. I do not know that that is your object to keep the passengers hungry.

All of passengers are hungry from yesterday morning. My men cannot go ashore till your further order, I have to get a reasonable answer for this.
